DESIGN FOR CUFF-BUTTONS.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,312**, dated May 4, 1875; application filed April 9, 1875.
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, LEONARD S. BEALS, of Astoria, in the county of Queens and State of New York, have invented a certain new Design for Cuff-Buttons, of which the following is a specification:

This invention is illustrated in the accompanying drawing, in which—

Figure 1 represents a face view. Fig. 2 is a sectional view.

Similar letters indicate corresponding parts.

This design consists of an angular button bearing a central head and a circle of pearls, the two latter being contained within a circular recess.

In the drawing, the letter A designates my button, which has a square outline, and is formed with a circular recess, *a*. Within the recess *a*, and in the center of the button, is a head, *b*, which is surrounded by a circle, *c*, of

pearls. The head *b* has a circular outline. The face of the button A is ornamented with triangular indentations so disposed as to form a zigzag line, *d*, near its edge.

What I claim as new, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

1. The design of the angular button A, central head *b*, and the circle *c*, substantially as shown and described.

2. The design of the angular button A, central head *b*, circle *c*, and recess *a*, substantially as shown and described.
