

DESIGN FOR FONT OF PRINTING-TYPES.

Specification forming part of Design No. 8,317, dated May 11, 1875; application filed February 26, 1875.

[Term of Patent 14 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JAMES MADISON CONNER, of the town of Greenville, county of Hudson, and State of New Jersey, have originated and designed a new Pattern or Design for a Font of Printing-Types, which I describe as follows:

First, the nature of my design is clearly shown in the accompanying typographic impression, to which reference is made, and which differs from every other kind of type in style and proportion; second, it consists of

caps, figures, and lower-case, heavy top and bottom, light upstrokes, arched at the sides, and free from ornamentation.

What I claim as my invention, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The design or pattern for a font of printingtypes, herein shown and described.
