

DESIGN FOR A MEDAL.

Specification forming part of Design No. 8,324, dated May 11, 1875; application filed April 21, 1875.

[Term of Patent 3; years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, John H. Schreiner, of the city of Philadelphia, State of Pennsylvania, have invented a certain new Design for Medals; and I do hereby declare the following to be a full, clear, and exact description of the same.

My design for a medal on the obverse side consists of a view of the "Art-Gallery," and on the reverse side of a view of the "Main Building," of the United States International Exhibition to be held in Fairmount Park, Philadelphia, in 1876, as shown in the accompanying fac-simile.

The figures in the accompanying fac-simile are geometrical views of front elevation of the Art-Gallery and Main Building, the former constituting the obverse, and the latter the reverse, side of said medal.

What I claim is-

1. The design for a medal, herein described,

and shown in the accompanying photograph of the geometrical view of front elevation of the Art-Gallery in Fairmount Park, Philadelphia.

2. The design for the reverse side of a medal, as herein described, and shown in the accompanying photograph of the geometrical view of front elevation of the Main Building of the International Exhibition, in Fairmount Park, Philadelphia.

3. The design for a medal having on the obverse side a geometrical view of front elevation of the Art-Gallery, and on the reverse side a geometrical view of front elevation of the Main Building of the International Exhibition to be held in Philadelphia, 1876.
