DESIGN FOR LAMP-PEDESTALS.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,328**, dated May 18, 1875; application filed May 4, 1875.
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, NATHANIEL L. BRADLEY, of West Meriden, in the county of New Haven and State of Connecticut, have invented a new Design for Lamp-Pedestal; and I do hereby declare the following, when taken in connection with the accompanying drawings and the letters of reference marked thereon, to be a full, clear, and exact description of the same, and which said drawings constitute part of this specification, and represent a perspective view.

This invention relates to a design for pedestal for lamps and other lights; and consists in a base, with a standard rising therefrom to support the burner, and a figure of a female and basket standing on the said base, as shown in the accompanying illustration.

a is the base, which may be of any desira-

ble shape or form. *b* is the post or standard which supports the lamp or burner, and beside which stands a female figure and a basket, also resting on the base.

In my Design Patent No. 7,161 a female figure is shown, but in dress and poise materially different.

I claim—

The herein-described design for lamp or burner pedestal, consisting of the base *a*, with the standard *b* rising therefrom, combined with the female figure and basket, both standing on the said base, as shown in the accompanying illustration, and herein described.
