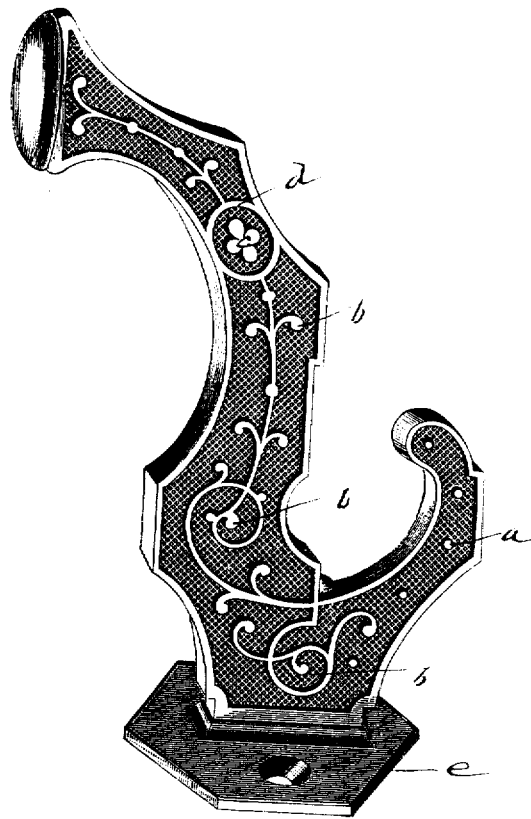

DESIGN FOR COAT AND HAT HOOKS.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,329**, dated May 18, 1875; application filed April 23, 1875.
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, FRANCIS T. FRACKER, of New Britain, in the county of Hartford and State of Connecticut, have invented or produced a Design for Coat and Hat Hook, of which the following is a specification

The accompanying wood-cut represents the said design.

The inner and outer edges of said hook are made up of a combination of curved and straight lines, in the manner shown. The sides are recessed, the inner surfaces of which are roughened in imitation of lace-work, and they are ornamented with dots, as at *a*, scroll-work *b*, leaves *c*, and oval *d*, as represented,

said ornaments being in relief. The base *e* is made beveling and of hexagonal form.

I claim as my invention—

1. The design of the coat and hat hook, the outer and inner edges of which are made up of a combination of curved and straight lines, as represented.

2. The design of the dots, scroll-work, leaves, and oval on the recessed parts, all substantially as shown.
