DESIGN FOR A GROUP OF STATUARY.

Specification forming part of Design No. **S,332**, dated May 18, 1875; application filed May 4, 1875.
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, HENRY W. HIRSCHFELD, of West Meriden, in the county of New Haven and State of Connecticut, have invented a new Design for a Group of Statuary; and I do hereby declare the following, when taken in connection with the accompanying drawings, to be a full, clear, and exact description of the same, and which said drawings constitute part of this specification, and represent a front view.

This invention relates to a design for group of statuary, and consists in the figure of a buffalo, and of a horse, on which is mounted an Indian, apparently pursuing and attacking

the buffalo. The figures are mounted on a base, the buffalo in advance at one end, the horse at the other, apparently advancing, with an Indian on his back in the attitude of attacking the buffalo, as shown in the accompanying illustration.

I claim—

The design for statuary group, representing a buffalo pursued by an Indian on horseback, as described, and shown in the accompanying illustration.
