

## DESIGN FOR AN ORNAMENT FOR BURIAL-CASKETS.

Specification forming part of Design No. 8,335, dated May 18, 1875; application filed April 17, 1875.

[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, W. MAX REID, of Amsterdam, in the county of Montgomery and State of New York, have invented a Design for Burial-Casket Ornaments, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying drawing, to which refer-

ence is made.

My design relates to ornaments to be applied to burial-cases, caskets, and coffins, and is composed of a cross and crown, united as shown in the accompanying drawing, and which may be made either ornamental or plain, and made of brass or other metal.

I am aware that the design of a cross and crown is not new, and I do not claim it, only as applied to a metal ornament, to be used on or upon a burial-case, coffin, or casket.

What I claim as my invention is-

The design for an ornament for burial-caskets, composed of the cross and crown, united substantially as described, and shown in the accompanying drawing.
