

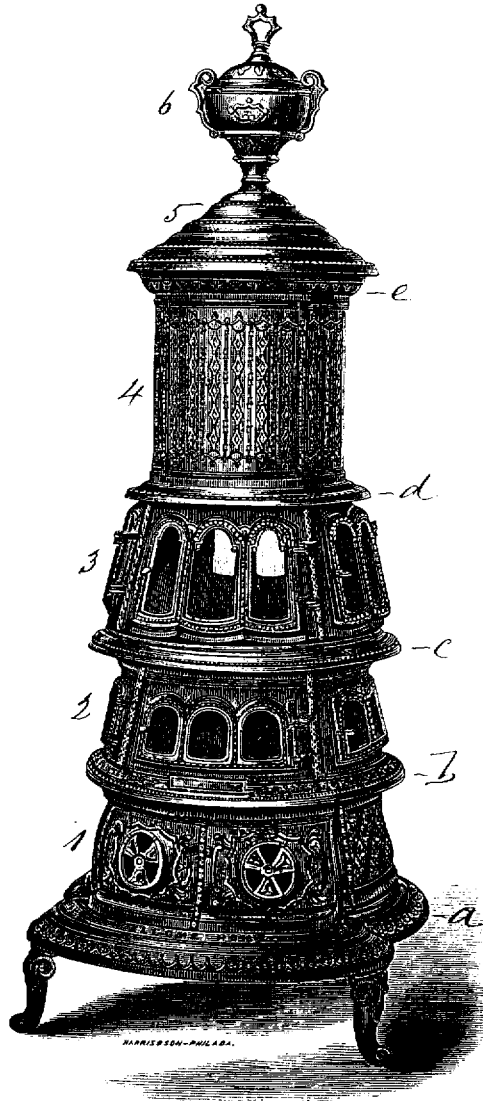

DESIGN FOR HEATING-STOVES.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,336**, dated May 18, 1875; application filed May 5, 1875.
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that we, GARRETTSON SMITH and HENRY BROWN, stove-pattern makers, of the city of Philadelphia, in the State of Pennsylvania, have invented a Design for Heating-Stoves, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of our design is fully illustrated in the accompanying engraving, to which reference is made.

To facilitate in describing our said design, the engraving may be referred to as consisting of six main portions, *i. e.*, 1 2 3 are three conical frustums supported, in the order named, upon projecting moldings *a b c*, respectively, as shown, and the whole upon carved legs in the ordinary manner. The portion 4 is cylindrical in form, with a projecting molding, *d*, at its supporting-base, which rests directly upon the upper end of the conical frustum 3, as shown; and resting upon the upper end of cylinder 4 is a projecting molding, *e*, as shown. The portion 5 is a horizontally-corrugated conical frustum resting upon *e*, and the portion 6 is an urn resting upon the top of 5, as shown. The plates con-

stituting the portion 1 and its supporting-molding *a* are respectively ornamented as shown. The plates constituting the portion 2 and its supporting-molding *b* are ornamented as shown. The plates constituting the portion 3 and its molding *c* are ornamented as shown. The cylindrical portion 4 and its moldings *d* and *e* are ornamented as shown. The portion 5 is corrugated and ornamented as shown. The urn 6 is shaped and ornamented as shown—the whole together forming an ornamental heating-stove, as shown, supported upon legs in the usual manner.

What we claim as our invention is—

A design for a heating-stove, in which the plates and moldings of the several portions 1 2 3 4 5 6 are shaped and ornamented substantially in the manner and form above described.
