DESIGN FOR A BASE-PANEL FOR VASES.

Specification forming part of Design No. 8,339, dated May 25, 1875; application filed April 19, 1875. [Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, MELVILLE D. JONES, of Boston, Suffolk county, Massachusetts, have invented a Design for Ornamentation of Vase-Pedestals, of which the following is a specification:

This design is upon the shaft of the pedestal of an ornamental vase.

The pedestal is composed of a polygonal frusto-pyramidal shaft, the outlines of whose faces a a, &c., are concave longitudinally to obtain a more graceful appearance. The ornamental design upon each face a consists of two leaves, b c, preferably Gothic oak, these leaves being disposed at the bottom of the face a, and with their stems uppermost, and curving inward toward each other, and being interlined or interlaced, and together occupying about half the face. The upper portion of each face a is occupied by an ornament, i, which consists of a union of portions of two leaves of the character of those below, with the stems of each thereon, and spreading outward.

The whole ornament is in basso-relievo upon a plain ground border by raised edges k k.

I claim-

The ornamental design for the base-panels of a vase, consisting of the curvilinear faces a, having thereupon the dually-arranged leaves be and the compound ornament i, substantially as described, and shown in the accompanying illustration.
