

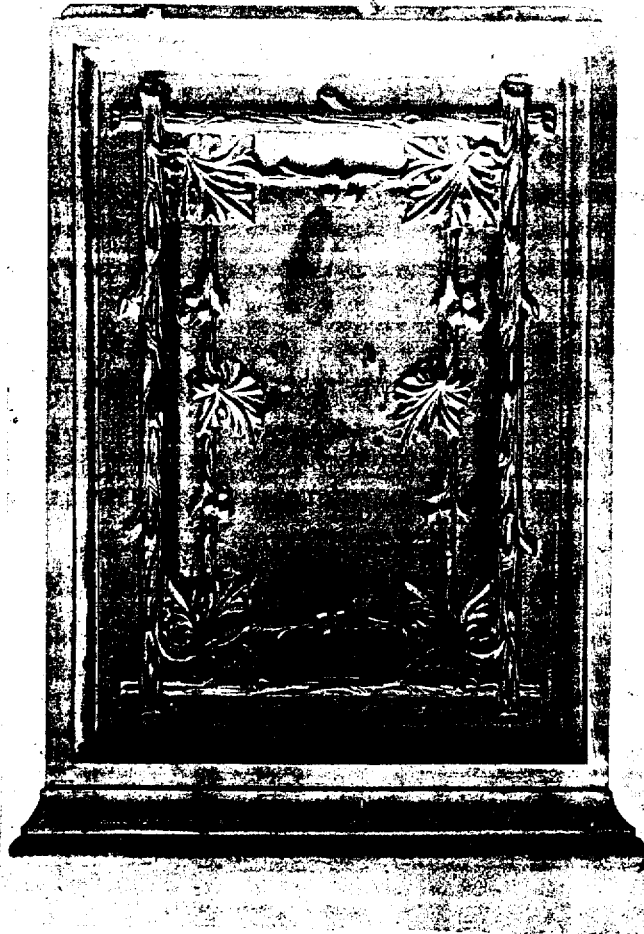

DESIGN FOR A PANEL FOR VASE-PEDESTALS.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,341**, dated May 25, 1875; application filed April 19, 1875.
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, MELVILLE D. JONES, of Boston, Suffolk county, Massachusetts, have invented a Design for Panel of Vase, of which the following is a specification:

This design is upon the base panels of the pedestal of an ornamental vase, and consists in affixing to or creating upon the tablet A of the panel, and about the four circumscribing sides thereof, and within the molding *ll*, &c., which define such panels, an ornamentation composed of two rustic frames, B C, of different sizes, one arranged within the other, each of which is made up of four rustic bars, *abcd* or *efgh*, disposed in a parallelogram. A leaf, D, preferably Gothic oak, has its stem at each intersecting angle of the outer frame, and covers the intersecting angles of the inner

frame, and constitutes the union between the two frames. The bars of the inner frame are further ornamented with leaves *ii* of a similar character, and with berries *kk*, &c., the whole comprising a neat and pleasing design.

The whole ornamentation is in basso-relievo, upon a plain ground.

I claim—

The design for the base panels of a pedestal for ornamental vases, composed essentially of the two frames B C, leaves D and *ii*, and berries *kk*, substantially as described, and shown in the accompanying illustration.
