

DESIGN FOR AN ORNAMENTAL STAR.

Specification forming part of Design No. 8,343, dated May 25, 1875; application filed March 17, 1875.

[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, WILLIAM MARTIN, of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, have invented or produced a Design for an Ornamental Star, of which the following is a specification:

My design for an ornamental star is clearly shown in the accompanying photographic illustration; and consists of a number of three-sided pyramidal projections, a, grouped together in the manner too clearly shown to need description. Each side of each pyramidal projection may be ornamented, and there may be a flower or other ornament where the corners of several projections meet.

I claim as my invention—

The design for an ornamental star, composed of the projections *a*, each having three sides nearly equal in size, and grouped together, as shown and described.
