

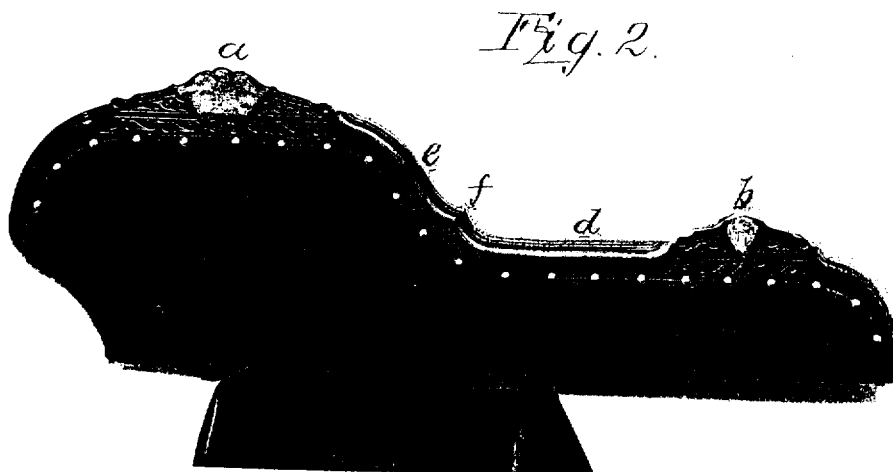
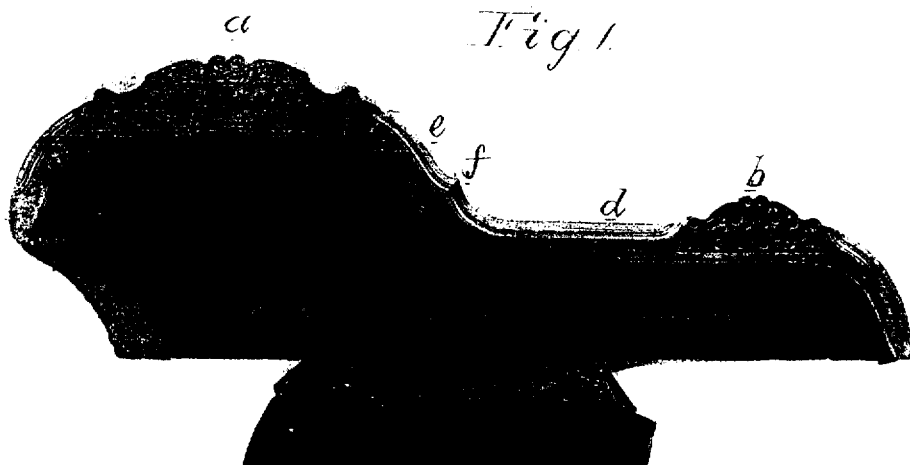

DESIGN FOR BACKS OF LOUNGES.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,353**, dated May 25, 1875; application filed April 2, 1875.
[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

CASE B.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, GEORGE HARTZELL, of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, have invented a Design for the Back of a Lounge, of which the following is a specification:

My design for the back of a lounge is fully shown in the accompanying photographic illustrations, the two views in which differ slightly in minor particulars without departing from the general character of the design, the latter consisting of the two ornamented portions *a* and *b*, between which intervene the straight edging *d* and curved edging *e* with the projection *f*. The portions *a* and *b* are provided with central figures, and are ornamented by scroll-work in a manner too clearly

shown in the drawing to need detailed description.

I claim—

The design for the back of a lounge, comprising the ornamental portions *a* and *b*, straight edging *d*, curved edging *e*, and projection *f*, all substantially as described, and as shown in and by the accompanying photographic illustration.
