DESIGN FOR A NECK-TIE.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,355**, dated May 25, 1875; application filed April 24, 1875.
[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, REGINALD R. PARKER, of Indianapolis, in the State of Indiana, have invented a new Design for a Neck-Tie or Scarf; and the following is a full description thereof:

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying photographic illustration, to which reference is made.

In the said photographic illustration, A is the shield, and B the scarf or tie.

Holding the shield A front toward the person tying, lay off one-third of the scarf, which pass over the front of the shield on the right;

pass the remainder from the back of the shield from right to left twice; then pass it over the top of the shield and down through the loop already formed, and properly confine the knot.

Having thus described my invention, what I claim as new, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The design for a neck-tie, as shown in the accompanying photographic illustration, and described substantially as set forth.
