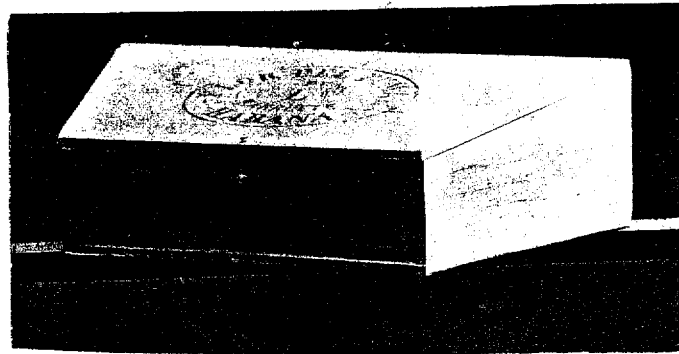

DESIGN FOR CIGAR-BOX.

Specification forming part of Design, No. **8,357**, dated May 25, 1875; application filed April 21, 1875.
[Term of patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, HENRY ZIMMERMANN, of Chicago, in the county of Cook and State of Illinois, have invented a Design for Cigar-Boxes, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying photographic illustration, to which reference is made.

A represents the box made of the common material. The box is constructed with one side, *a*, shorter and lower than the opposite side, from which side *a* the ends of the box diverge to said longer side. The ends of the box *b* are themselves made higher at the part *b'*, that is secured to the larger and longer

side, thus leaving the top of the box *c* on an incline toward the smaller side *a*. The top is cut to fit the shape of the box; it is equal in length to the side *a* and diverges to the larger side, so as to cover the end-pieces *b*. The bottom of the box is similar in shape to the top.

What I claim as my invention is—

The design of a rectangular prismoidal box for cigars, substantially as represented and described.
