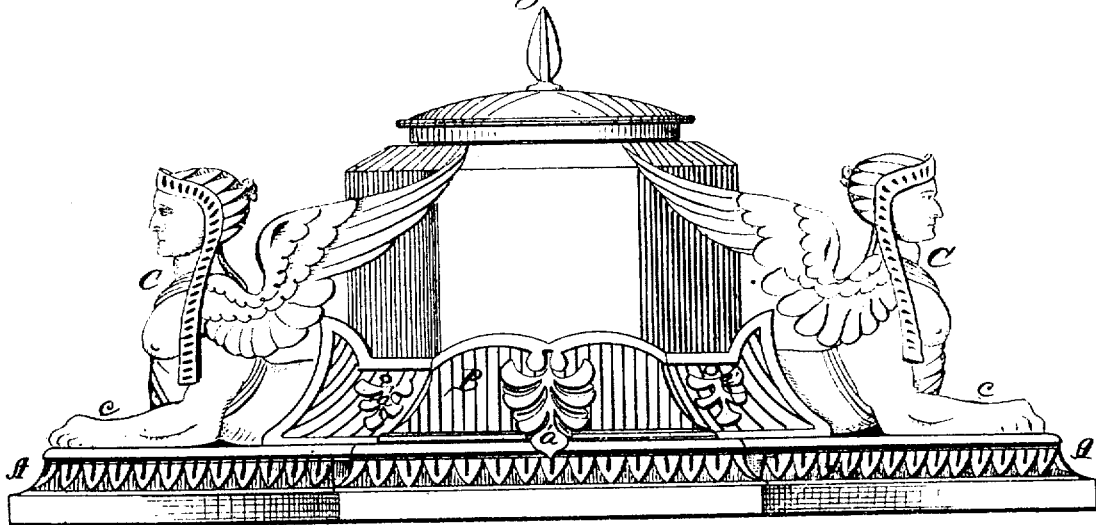
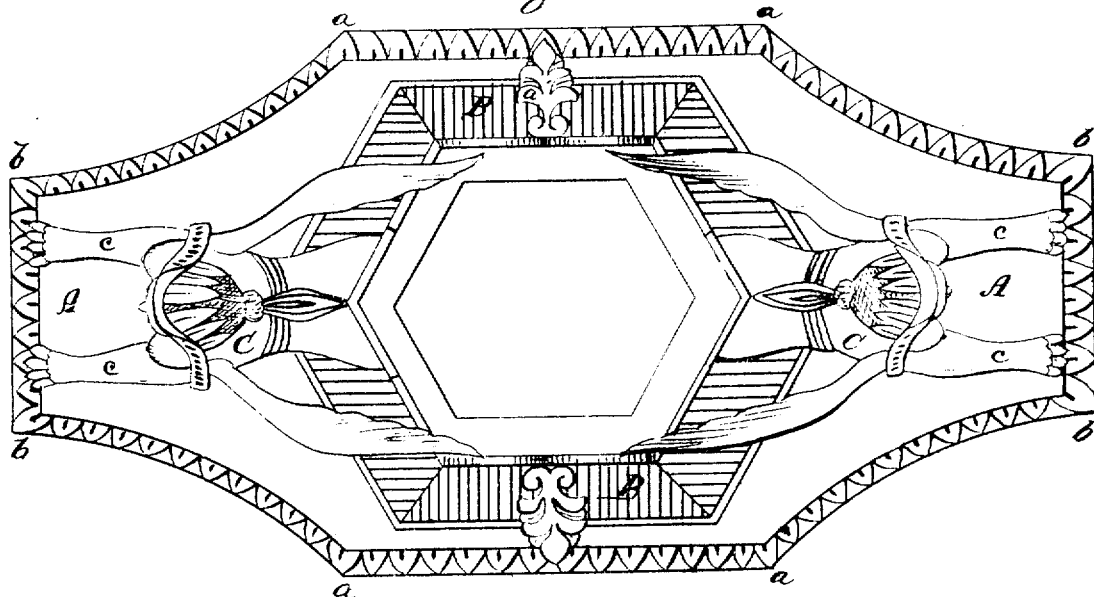

DESIGN FOR INKSTAND-SUPPORTS.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,360**, dated June 1, 1875; application filed May 14, 1875.
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

CASE B.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, CHARLES KITSCHOLT, of the city, county, and State of New York, have invented a Design for Supports for Inkstands, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying drawings, to which reference is made, and in which—

Figure 1 is a side, and Fig. 2 a plan, view, representing my design aforesaid.

A is the base, narrowed at each end, as shown, from *a* to *b*, and with, at its central portion, a raised border, *b*, the outer surface of which may be made sloping, and shaped in ribbed and fluted work, diversified with leaves, as shown at *a'*. Springing from this border, at each end, is a miniature winged sphinx, C, the fore-arms and feet *e* of which project forward toward the extremities of the base, the

head and neck vertical, and the wings upward, backward, and outward, with their extremities at nearly equal distances from a vertical line coincident with the center of the base.

It is intended to form this design in bronze or other metal or hard material, and the inkstand is placed upon the central part, surrounded by the raised border B.

What I claim as my invention is—

The design for an inkstand-support, comprising the winged sphinxes C, the raised border B, and the base A, the whole having the contour and configuration substantially as herein set forth.
