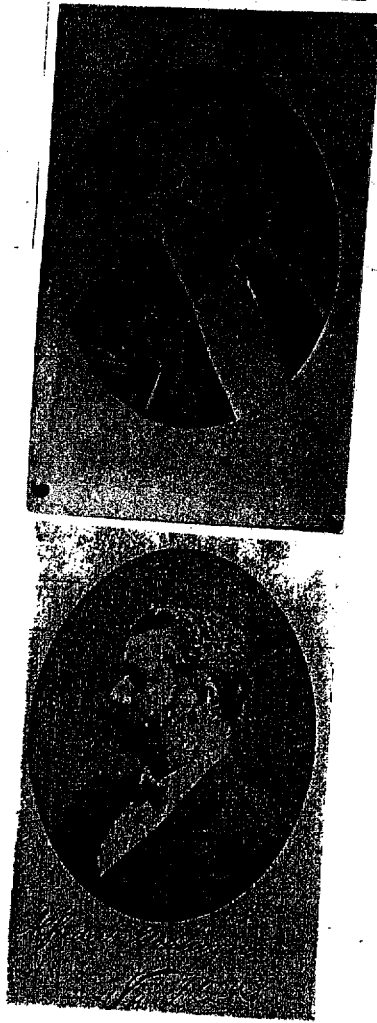

DESIGN FOR A MEDAL.

Specification forming part of Design No. 8,365, dated June 1, 1875; application filed May 26, 1875.
[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JOHN H. SCHREINER, of the city and county of Philadelphia and State of Pennsylvania, have invented a Design for a Medal, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying photographic illustration, to which reference is made.

My design for a medal consists of a likeness of General Joseph R. Hawley, President of the United States International Exposition, Philadelphia, 1876, on one side, and on the reverse side a likeness of Alfred T. Goshorn, Director-General of the United States International Exposition, to be held in Fairmount Park, Philadelphia, in 1876.

What I claim is—

1. The design for a medal, having on one

side a profile likeness of General Joseph R. Hawley, substantially as described, and shown in the accompanying photographic illustration.

2. The design for a medal, having on the reverse side a profile likeness of Alfred T. Goshorn, substantially as described, and shown in the accompanying photographic illustration.

3. The design for a medal, having on the obverse side a likeness of General Joseph R. Hawley, and on the reverse side a likeness of Alfred T. Goshorn, substantially as described and shown.
