

DESIGN FOR A MEDAL.

Specification forming part of Design No. 8.366, dated June 1, 1875; application filed May 8, 1875. [Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, ISAAC TOWNSEND, of the city and county of Philadelphia, State of Pennsylvania, have originated and designed a Medal, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying drawing making a part of

this specification.

The nature of my invention is fully represented in the accompanying drawing, to which reference is made; and it consists in a design for a medal having on one side a representa-tion of the Masonic Temple as lately crected in the city of New York. Above the figure of the said building are the words "Masonic Temple," and below it the words "New York." On the reverse side of the medal is a representation of a Masonic keystone, bearing let-

ters peculiar to the order, and surrounded with the following words and figures: "Dedicated June 2nd, 1875."

My design may be cast or otherwise formed in metal or any other material.

What I claim as my invention is-

The design for a medal, on one side of which is a representation of the Masonic Temple as erected in the city of New York, and the words "Masonic Temple," "New York," and on the reverse side the figure of a Masonic keystone and the words and figures "Dedicated June 2nd, 1875," substantially as described and shown.
