

DESIGN FOR A VASE.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,368**, dated June 1, 1875; application filed May 4, 1875. [Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, Joseph W. Fiske, of New York, in the county of New York and State of New York, have invented certain Improvements in Designs for a Vase, of which the following is a specification:

My invention relates to that class of vases used for growing plants, and for ornamenting pleasure-grounds, door-yards, and the like, and the invention consists of the design for such an article.

The design is fully shown in the accompanying photograph, to which reference is hereby made. The vase, as there shown, is pro-

vided on opposite sides with handles of peculiar and novel design. The rim of the bowl of the vase, as also the lower portion of its body, together with its base, is ornamented by figures in relief, as shown in the illustration. The design may be made in cast-iron or any suitable material.

What I claim as my invention is—

The design for a vase, as herein shown and described.
