

DESIGN FOR A LAWYER'S BADGE.

Specification forming part of Design No. 8,371, dated June 1, 1875; application filed February 12, 1875.

[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, SIMPSON L. HARMON, of Batesville, in the county of Panola and State of Mississippi, have invented and produced a new Design for a Lawyer's Badge; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description thereof, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, which form a part of this specification.

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying photographic illustration, to which reference is made; and consists of a metal shield, on which is represented a judge, judge's stand, two lawyers, a book, and a pair of scales.

The distinctive character of my design is found in the figures, which are wrought into or upon a shield, as shown.

What I claim as my invention is-

The design for a lawyer's badge or shield, with the figures placed thereon, substantially as shown and described.
