DESIGN FOR A NEWSPAPER-RACK.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,373**, dated June 8, 1875; application filed February 27, 1875.

[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, HORACE Z. BAKER, of the city and county of Providence, in the State of Rhode Island, have invented a Design for a Newspaper-Rack, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my invention is fully represented in the accompanying drawing, to which reference is made.

The rack consists of two side strips, A A, connected by cross-wires c c, and has a suit-

able number of proper-shaped wires, a a a, attached to the side strips at right angles to the cross-wires c c.

I claim—

The design for a paper-rack, substantially as shown, consisting of two side strips, A A, cross-wires c c, and the wires a a a.
