

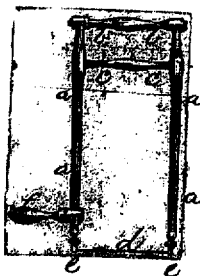

## DESIGN FOR BRACKET-SAW FRAMES.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,381**, dated June 8, 1875; application filed February 5, 1875.  
[Term of Patent  $3\frac{1}{2}$  years.]

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, HENRY L. PRATT, of Brooklyn, Kings county, New York, have invented a new Design for Bracket-Saw Frames, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying illustration.

The frame consists of two parallel round rods, *a a*, connected together at one extremity by the two turned bars *b* and *c*. *d* is the saw-blade, and *e e* the clamps at the extremities of

the rods *a a*, for securing the saw in the frame. *f* is a handle secured on one of the rods *a*, near the clamp extremity.

What I claim is—

The design for a bracket-saw-frame, as shown.
