

DESIGN FOR BRACKET-SAW FRAMES.

Specification forming part of Design No. 8,381, dated June 8, 1875; application filed February 5, 1875. [Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, HENRY L. PRATT, of Brooklyn, Kings county, New York, have invented a new Design for Bracket-Saw Frames, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying illustration.

The frame consists of two parallel round rods. a a. connected together at one extremity.

rods, a a, connected together at one extremity by the two turned bars b and c. d is the sawblade, and e e the clamps at the extremities of

the rods a a, for securing the saw in the frame. f is a handle secured on one of the rods a, near the clamp extremity.

What I claim is—

The design for a bracket-saw frame, as shown.
