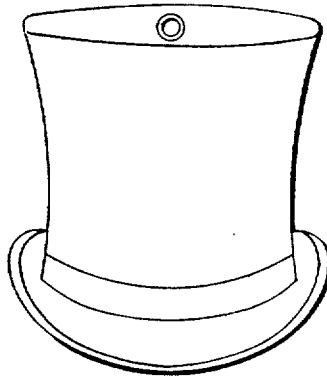

DESIGN FOR WRITING-TABLETS.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,382**, dated June 8, 1875; application filed April 29, 1875.
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, J. M. QUACKENBOS, JR., of New York city, in the county of New York and State of New York, have invented certain new and useful Improvements in Designs for Tablets; and I do hereby declare the following to be a full, clear, and exact description of the invention, such as will enable others skilled in the art to which it pertains to make and use it, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, which form part of this specification.

My invention relates to a new and attractive design for a tablet: and consists in giving to such in outline the shape and appearance of a hat, as illustrated in the accompanying drawing.

Heretofore pocket-tablets have been universally made of a rectangular shape, in which there is nothing of beauty or design that either attracts the attention or pleases the eye. In order to obviate this I propose to give the

tablet the form of a hat, substantially as shown, which, while being a familiar object, is yet novel as a tablet, and for this reason the attention of many who would not notice an ordinary tablet will be directed to it.

I do not wish to be understood as limiting myself to the precise shape of the hat here shown, as such hats vary in shape and style according to the season, and still preserve their identity with hats of such class.

What I claim is—

A design for a tablet having the shape and appearance in outline of a hat, substantially as shown and set forth.
