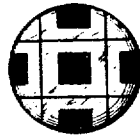

DESIGN FOR BUTTONS.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,384**, dated June 8, 1875; application filed May 31, 1875.
[Term of Patent $3\frac{1}{2}$ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JOSEPH R. SMITH, of Waterbury, in the county of New Haven and State of Connecticut, have invented a new Design for Button; and I do hereby declare the following, when taken in connection with the accompanying drawings and the letters of reference marked thereon, to be a full, clear, and exact description of the same, and which said drawings constitute part of this specification, and represent a face view.

This invention relates to a design for metallic buttons, the object being to give to the button an inlaid appearance; and it consists in a surface indicating an inlaid plaid, as shown in the accompanying illustration.

The surface generally is that known as "Moire Metalique." In the surface lines are produced, indicating a plaid, as shown in the accompanying illustration, and this feature constitutes the peculiar characteristic of this design.

I claim—

The design for button, as shown and described, consisting of a plaid moire-metalique surface, substantially as specified.
