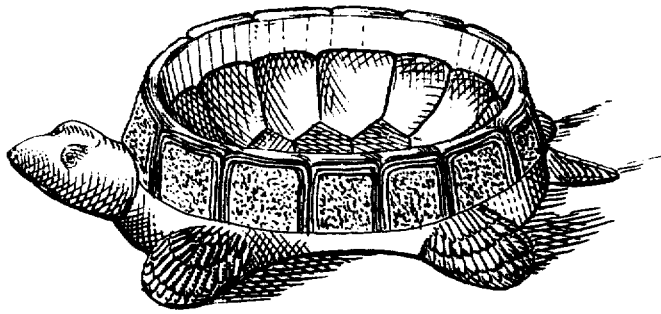

DESIGN FOR GLASSWARE.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,387**, dated June 15, 1875; application filed May 27, 1875.
[Term of Patent 14 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, WILLIAM LEIGHTON, Jr., of Wheeling, county of Ohio, State of West Virginia, have invented or discovered a new and useful Design for Glassware; and I do hereby declare the following to be a full, clear, concise, and exact description thereof, reference being had to the accompanying drawing making a part of this specification, in which (like letters indicating like parts)—

Figure 1 represents my improved design, in perspective, as applied to a salt-cellar.

My improved design for glassware consists of a glass dish made, in the base or supporting part thereof, of the form of a four-footed or flippered reptile, and made with a cavity, bowl, or other hollow-shaped receptacle, *a*, in or on the upper shell, back, or body of the same, such cavity having any desired capac-

ity, according to the purpose for which it is intended.

I apply this design not only to salt-cellar, but also to bowl-shaped or hollow articles of glassware generally, with the reptile supporting the bowl, and hence the relative proportions of the two may be varied at pleasure.

I claim as my improved design for glassware—

•A four-footed or flippered reptile-shaped glass base supporting a bowl-cavity made therein or thereon, substantially as shown and described.
