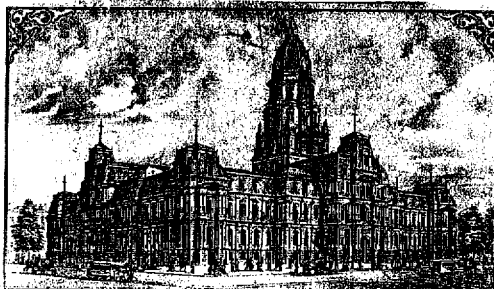

JOSEPH W. LINGG, OF PHILADELPHIA, PENNSYLVANIA.

DESIGN FOR A MEDAL.

Specification forming part of Design No. 8,388, dated June 15, 1875; application filed April 28, 1875.
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JOSEPH W. LINGG, of Philadelphia, in the county of Philadelphia and State of Pennsylvania, have invented a certain new and useful Design for Medals; and I do hereby declare the following to be a full, clear, and exact description of the same, reference being had to the accompanying photographs, representing, respectively, designs on the obverse and reverse sides of the medal.

My design for a medal consists in the representation, upon the obverse side, of the likenesses in profile of the Rt. Rev. John Wood, Archbishop of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, and upon the reverse, of the new public buildings at Broad and Market streets, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania.

I claim—

1. A design for a medal, consisting in the representation, upon the obverse side, of the

likeness of the Rt. Rev. John Wood, of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, as shown.

2. A design for a medal, consisting in the representation, upon the reverse side, of the new public buildings, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, as shown.

3. A design for a medal representing, upon the obverse and reverse sides, respectively, the likeness of Rt. Rev. John Wood, of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, and the new public buildings, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, substantially as shown.
