

DESIGN FOR HANDLES OF TABLE-KNIVES.

Specification forming part of Design No. 8,389, dated June 15, 1875; application filed April 3, 1875. [Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, LUCAS J. MARCH, of Deerfield, in the county of Franklin and State of Massachusetts, have invented a new and original Design for Handles of Table-Knives, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my design is fully represented

in the accompanying drawing.

Figure 1 represents the knife-blade. Fig. 2 is a cross-section of the handle, taken on the line w w. Fig. 3 is a cross-section, taken on the line w x. Fig. 4 is a cross-section of the handle, taken on the line y y.

Similar letters of reference indicate corre-

sponding parts.

The shape and form of the handle are shown by these cross-sections. At w w the handle is shown by a, looking from the line toward the blade. From this line the handle slopes to the ridge b, from which ridge it diminishes slightly to the line x x, where it forms a blunt

oval, d. From line x x it gradually increases in width and diminishes in thickness to the line y y, as seen at c. From y y the handle diminishes in width to a point, C, but retains its thickness to near the end. This handle is perfectly smooth throughout, and the whole knife-handle and blade are made of one piece of steel.

The essential features of this design are the form of the handle indicated by the cross-sections, and being formed (with the blade) of polished steel, as shown.

This handle may be made of any size to suit the blade and the market.

I claim as my invention-

The above-described design for knife-handles, as set forth and shown in the drawing.
