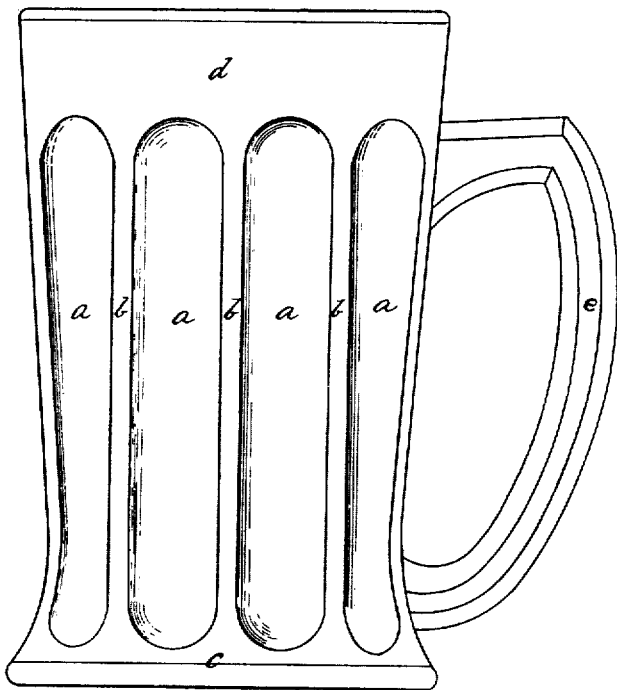

THOMAS C. PEARS, OF PITTSBURG, PENNSYLVANIA.

DESIGN FOR BEER-MUGS, ALE-GLASSES, &c.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,390**, dated June 15, 1875; application filed May 31, 1875.

[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, THOMAS C. PEARS, of Pittsburg, in the county of Allegheny and State of Pennsylvania, have invented a new and useful Design for Beer-Mugs, Ale-Glasses, &c.; and I do hereby declare the following to be a full, clear, and exact description thereof, reference being had to the accompanying drawing forming a part of this specification and illustrating my invention.

My design is intended more especially for beer-mugs, ale-glasses, and similar ware; and consists in a series of vertical finger-flutes, arranged parallel, and at such a distance apart as to leave smooth or plain faces between the flutes, said vertical flutes preferably terminating a little distance above the bottom and below the top of the article so ornamented.

In the drawing, *a a* represent a series of finger-flutes, arranged around the article at such distances apart as to leave intermediate plain faces *b b*, and terminating a short distance above the foot, which is preferably flared, as

shown, leaving a plain surface, *c*, below. The lip of the article may be flared somewhat, as shown, and the finger-flutes *a* will terminate sufficiently far below the rim to leave a second plain surface, *d*, as shown. *e* represents the usual handle of a beer-mug.

What I claim as my invention is—

1. A design for beer-mugs, ale-glasses, &c., composed of a series of vertical finger-flutes, arranged around the article so as to leave intermediate plain surfaces, substantially as specified.

2. A design for beer-mugs, ale-glasses, &c., composed of a series of finger-flutes, arranged around the article so as to leave plain surfaces between the flutes, and above and below the flutes, substantially as specified.
