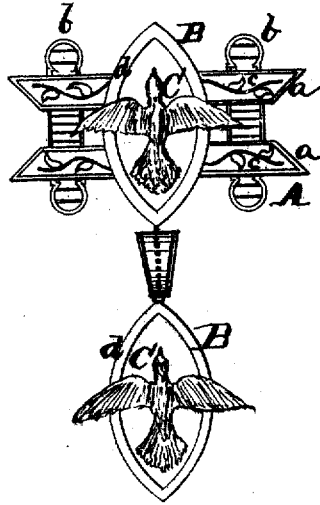

DESIGN FOR BREASTPIN.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,408**, dated June 22, 1875; application filed June 2, 1875.

[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

CASE C'.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, LEONARD S. BEALS, of Astoria, in the county of Queens and State of New York, have originated and designed a Pattern for Breastpin and Pendant, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, making part of this specification.

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying drawing, in which—

Figure 1 represents a face view. Fig. 2 is a transverse section.

Similar letters indicate corresponding parts.

The body A of my breastpin is composed of two longitudinal bars, *a a*, supported by two transverse bars, *b b*. The longitudinal bars are ornamented by leaves *c*, and the surfaces of the transverse bars are corrugated. On the longitudinal bars rests an almond-shaped cup,

B, provided with a flat polished rim, *d*, and in said cup rests the figure of a bird, C. The pendant is composed of a similar cup and bird.

What I claim as new, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

1. The design for a breastpin, the body A of which is composed of two longitudinal bars, *a a*, supported by transverse bars *b b*, as shown and described.

2. The design for a breastpin composed of the body A, the almond-shaped cup B, and the figure of a bird, C, as shown and described.
