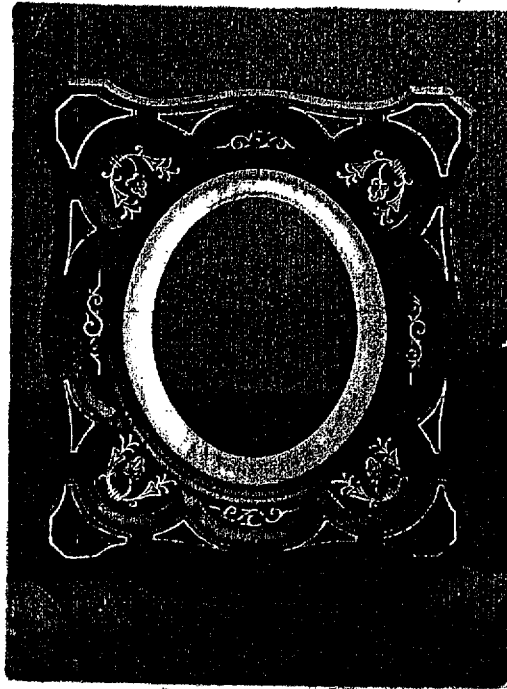

EDWARD BECK AND STEPHEN BIRD, OF LOCKPORT, NEW YORK.

DESIGN FOR A PICTURE-FRAME.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,410**, dated June 22, 1875; application filed June 5, 1875.
[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that we, EDWARD BECK and STEPHEN BIRD, of Lockport, Niagara county, New York, have invented a Design for a Picture-Frame, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of our design for a picture-frame is fully represented in the accompanying photographic illustration, to which reference is made.

The outline consists of the curved lines A between the projecting three-sided corners B, the edges being beveled and ornamented with a bead. Between the outlines and the inner plain border C is a depression in the frame, the line of which is wrought in half-circles D at the corners and elongated curves E between the corners, and in the planes bounded partially by these curves are tracery orna-

ments F G wrought in gold, and on the surface outside of the line D E are plain raised ornaments H, embellished with gold stripes.

We claim as our invention—

The design for a picture-frame, consisting of the beveled and beaded outer edge of the frame wrought in curves A and projecting corners B, as described and shown; the half-circles D and curves E bordering the inner depressed portion of the frame, as described and shown; the planes bounded by the half-circles D and curves E, ornamented with the gold tracery F and G, as described and shown.
