DESIGN FOR EMBROIDERY-PATTERN.

To all whom it may concern :

Be it known that I, EMIL CRISAND, of New Haven, in the county of New Haven and State of Connecticut, have invented a new Design for Embroidery-Pattern; and I do hereby declare the following, when taken in connection with the accompanying drawings and the letters of reference marked thereon, to be a full, clear, and exact description of the same, and which said drawings constitute part of this specification, and represent a face view.

This invention relates to a design for embroidery-pattern, with special reference to perforated board, designed to indicate the portion of the surface to be covered by embroidery. It consists in the peculiar configuration and arrangement of the letters forming the motto and an emblem, as clearly shown in the accompanying illustration.

The motto which constitutes the design is "The Old Oaken Bucket," combined with a representation of a well as the emblem. The letters which compose the last three words constitute the principal characteristic of this design. The letters are arranged in a segmental line, beneath which is the emblem, all as shown in the accompanying illustration.

I claim—

The design for embroidery-pattern herein described, composed of the motto "The Old Oaken Bucket," in form as shown in the accompanying illustration.
