DESIGN FOR A COMB.

Specification forming part of Design No. 8,413, dated June 22, 1875; application filed June 9, 1875.

[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, GEORGE G. MILLER, of the city and county of Philadelphia and State of Pennsylvania, have originated and designed a new and useful Ornamental Design for Head of a Comb, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to accompanying drawing, making part of this specification.

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying drawing, to which refer-

ence is made.

The upper line of the head A is scalloped as at a, and curves b are described from the points of intersection of the scallops, so that there is presented the appearance of a series of contiguous circles. Are-shaped openings c are formed in the circles, so that in the cen-

ters of the latter there are left elliptical-shaped pieces d; or, in other words, the circles may be said to be rings, which are united centrally by elliptical-shaped studs or pieces d. At a point above the teeth there may be formed openings e e, which relieve the appearance of the center of the head.

The design will be found to be neat, graceful, and attractive.

What I claim as my invention is-

A design for a head of a comb, composed of a series of circles, a b, having arc-shaped openings c and elliptical-shaped pieces d, substantially as above set forth and shown.
