

DESIGN FOR ORNAMENTAL BORDER FOR SILVER-WARE.

Specification forming part of Design No. 8,414, dated June 22, 1875; application filed May 23, 1875. [Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, CHARLES OSBORNE, of North Attleborough, Bristol county, Massachusetts, have invented and produced a new and original Design for Bordering for the Ornamentation of Silver-Ware and analogous goods, which I propose to distinguish by the term "griffin bordering;" and that the following is a full and accurate description thereof, reference being had to the accompanying photographic illustration, which forms a part of this specification.

My design is eminently fitted for the embellishment of silver-ware, whether cups, pictures, napkin-rings, goblets, or the like. I have wrought out the design in the style known to artists as "renaissance." I employ a central band or running pattern of griffins, whose tails, forked and convoluted, and running into ornamental devices, bind together

the whole by a series of scrolls and flowers. It is bordered by a pattern composed of bunches of leaves with berries, separated from

the central running ornaments by a small twisted molding, and finished on the outside by heavy moldings, which serve as an edge or border to the whole design.

What I claim is—

The design for an ornamental border for silver-ware, consisting of, first, a running pattern of griffins with connected parts, extended and interlaced as herein specified; second, the design composed of the line of griffins, in combination with the lines of leaves and berries on either side, as shown; third, the design composed of griffins, scrolls, leaves, and moldings, as herein specified and shown.
