

DESIGN FOR DESKS.

Specification forming part of Design No. 8,416, dated June 22, 1875; application filed May 11, 1875.

[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, CHARLES RICHTER, of Dedham, in the county of Norfolk and State of Massachusetts, have invented a new and ornamental Design for an Escritoire; and do hereby declare the same to be fully described in the following specification and represented in the accompanying drawing or photograph, which is a perspective view of an escritoire or upright desk, as designed by me.

The design in question relates to the front of the article, and includes the lower pilasters a a, and their paneled cornice b, with the paneled door c, and the foot-arch d; also, the second or upper set of pilasters e e, the paneled

lid f, the shelves gh, the brackets i i, the open back k, and its ornamental cross l, and the ornamental pediment m, with its finials n, all as shown.

I claim as my invention—

The said design, as described and represented, it consisting of the pilasters a a e e, the foot-arch d, the cornice b, paneled docus e f, shelf g, brackets i i, open back k, cross l, and pediment m, all formed and arranged as shown.
