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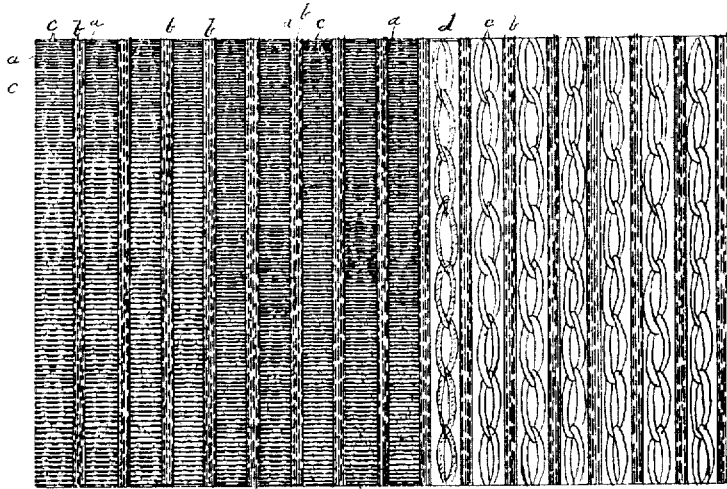

## DESIGN FOR CASSIMERES.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,418**, dated June 22, 1875; application filed June 8, 1875.  
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, EDWARD C. CLARK, of Rockville, in the county of Tolland and State of Connecticut, have invented a Design for Cassimeres, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying illustration, to which reference is made.

The body or ground *a* of the fabric is of any desired color, divided into parallel stripes by means of narrow cords *b*, and between these cords, and woven into the ground, are chain-links *c*, parallel with the cords *b*, and the chain-links are variegated with a fine colored thread, contrasting with the color of the main part of the chain, as seen in stripe *d*.

I do not limit myself to any particular color for the cord, ground, or chain.

What I claim as my invention is—

1. The design for cassimeres, consisting of the ground, cords, and chain-links woven into the ground between the cords, as shown and described.

2. The chain-links in parallel rows on the ground, and variegated or spotted with a contrasting color, as set forth.
