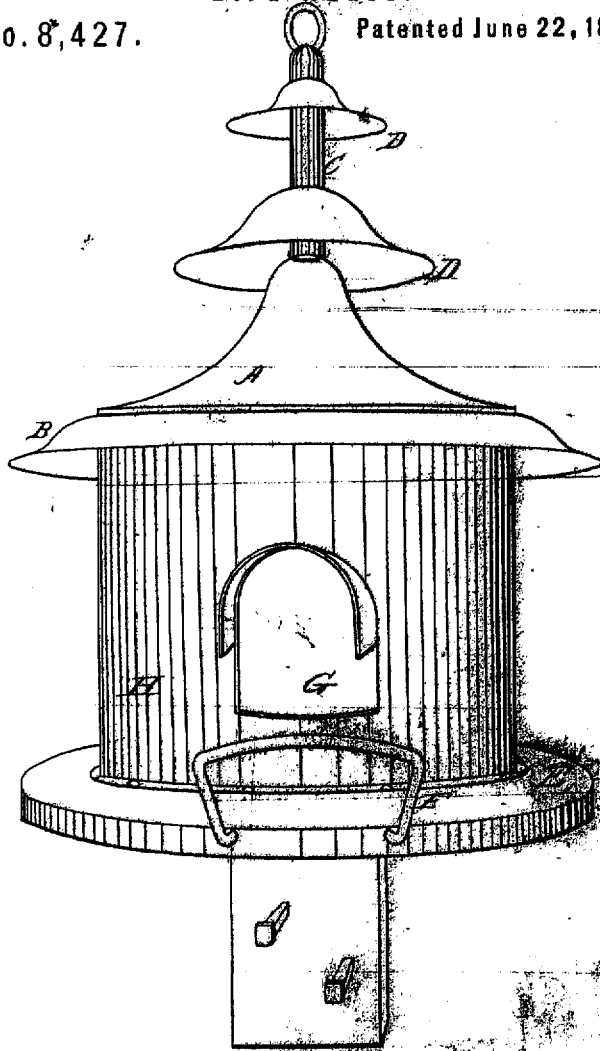

DESIGN FOR BIRD-HOUSES.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,427**, dated June 22, 1875; application filed May 17, 1875.
[Term of Patent 7 years]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JOSEPH WHITE, of Philadelphia, in the county of Philadelphia and State of Pennsylvania, have invented certain new and useful Designs for Bird-Houses; and I do hereby declare the following to be a full, clear, and exact description of the invention, such as will enable others skilled in the art to which it pertains to make and use it, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, which form part of this specification, in which is shown a perspective view of my invention.

This design consists of a bird-house, with the characteristic features of a pointed flaring roof, A, projecting eaves B, central standard or pole C, and canopies D. The base of the

house is encircled by a porch, E, to which is attached a wire rest, F, fronting the entrance G. The body H of the house may be cylindrical or otherwise, the roof and other parts being made to correspond.

I claim—

The design for a bird-house, comprising the body H, converging roof A, base E, overlapping eaves B, and pole C, with conical canopies D D, substantially as shown.
