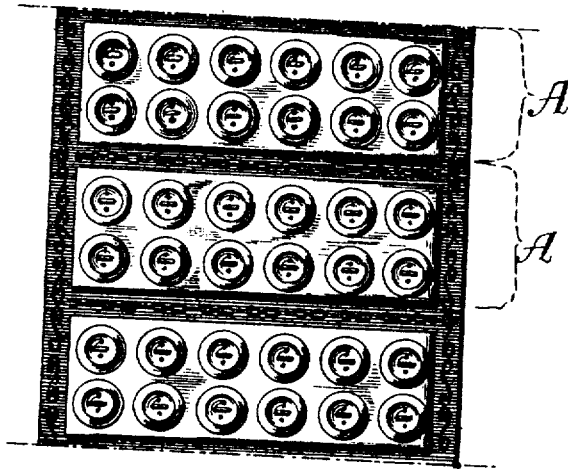

DESIGN FOR A CARD OF BUTTONS.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,443**, dated June 29, 1875; application filed May 7, 1875.
[Term of Patent 14 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, GEORGE P. FARMER, of Brooklyn, New York, have invented a Design for a Card of Buttons, of which the following is a specification:

The face of the card, part only of which is represented in the accompanying drawing, is separated by narrow bands into oblong spaces A, each of which is covered with foil, on which twelve pearl buttons are arranged, the buttons being stitched to the card.

The bands between the spaces may be ornamented in any suitable manner, so as to impart a pleasing effect to the card.

Irrespective of any specific colors of card, foil, or printed ornaments, I claim—

The design for a card of buttons, substantially as described, and as illustrated in and by the accompanying drawing.
