To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, CARL EMIL HEYER, of Boston, in the county of Suffolk and State of Massachusetts, have invented a Design for Printing-Types, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying impression from the types, to which reference is made.

The face, consisting of capitals, small-caps, and subaltern letters, with figures and points,

is a Roman letter of the last century in general appearance, but with some original variations; and

What I claim is—

The design for a font of printing types, as shown and described.
