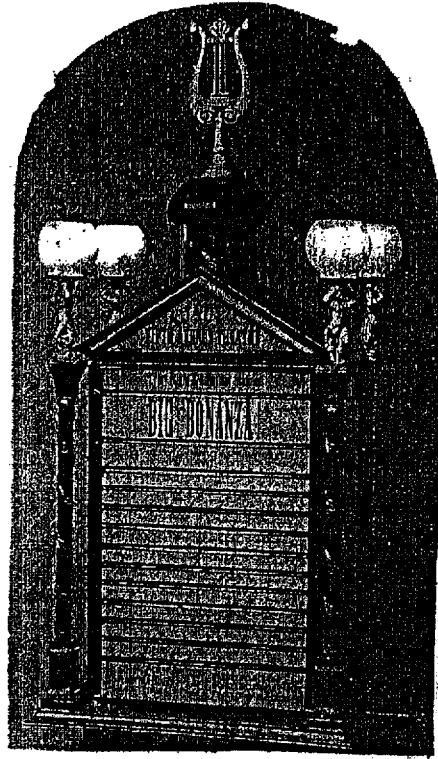

DESIGN FOR AN ADVERTISING-LANTERN.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,449**, dated June 29, 1875; application filed May 22, 1875.
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, FRANCIS L. PISCH, of the city, county, and State of New York, have invented a new and Improved Design for an Advertising-Lantern, of which the following is a specification:

My design is fully represented in the accompanying photographic illustration, to which reference is made.

The body of the lantern is rectangular in form, and is made with a peaked roof, upon the ridge of which is a cupola surmounted by a lyre. The sides of the lantern are divided into spaces by a number of cross-bars. Upon each corner of the base of the lantern stands a pillar, around which is twined a spiral or-

namental wreath, and which is surmounted with a globe-holder in the form of a small statuette.

I claim as new and desire to secure by Letters Patent—

1. The design for an advertising-lantern, composed of the rectangular body with a gable top, a cupola, and lyre, as shown.

2. The combination of the rectangular frame or body of the lantern, having a gable-roof, the surmounting cupola and lyre, and the side column supporting statuettes, as shown.
