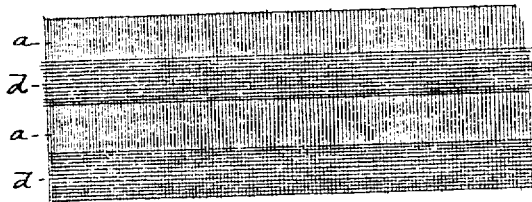

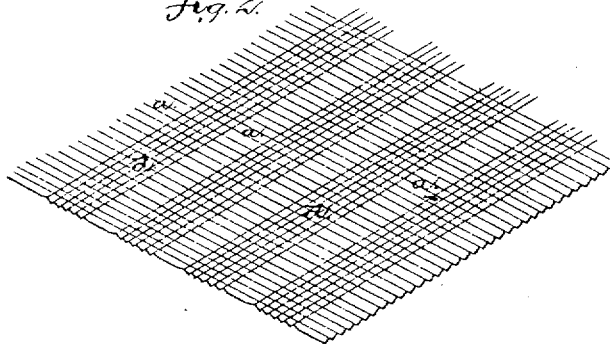

## DESIGN FOR WRITING-PAPER.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,452**, dated July 6, 1875; application filed May 31, 1875.  
[Term of Patent 14 years.]

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, HENRY D. CONE, of Stockbridge, in the county of Berkshire and State of Massachusetts, have invented a new Design for Paper; and I do hereby declare the following, when taken in connection with the accompanying drawings and the letters of reference marked thereon, to be a full, clear, and exact description of the same, and which said drawings constitute part of this specification, and represent a face view.

This invention relates to a design for writing-paper, in which the surface is ornamented by corrugations; and it consists in alternate sections or spaces—one of vertical lines, the other of combined vertical and longitudinal lines—as shown in the accompanying illustrations.

*a a* are sections formed by vertical corrugations, and between these the sections *d* are corrugated, both vertically and longitudinally, giving to these sections *d* a checked appearance. The width of these sections is, by preference, made substantially equal, so that the sections form lines for the convenience of the writer; but the width of these spaces constitutes no essential part of this design.

I claim—

The design for paper, as herein described, consisting of sections of vertical corrugations, alternating with sections of combined vertical and longitudinal corrugations, substantially as described.
