

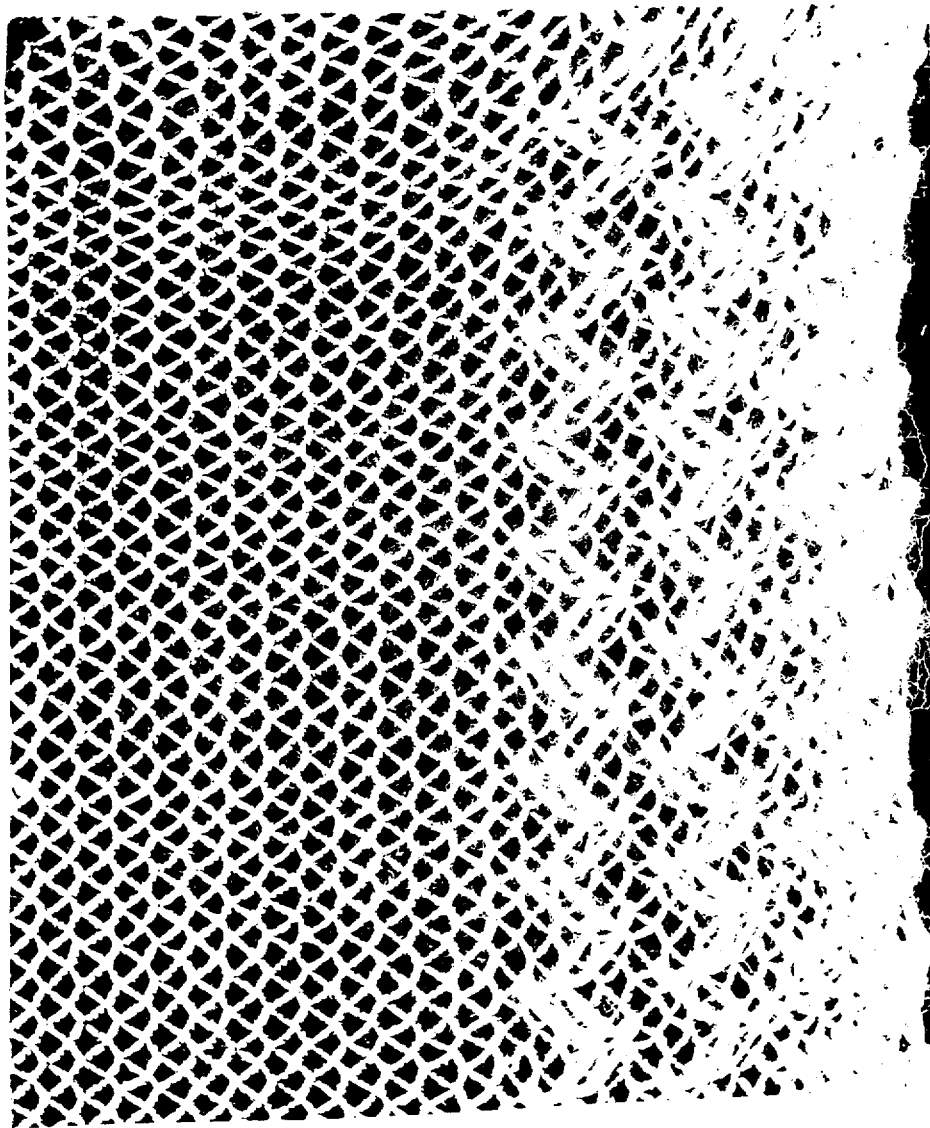

## DESIGN FOR A NUBIA.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,455**, dated July 6, 1875; application filed June 7, 1875.  
[Term of Patent  $3\frac{1}{2}$  years.]

### CASE A.

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, JAMES PHIPPS, of the city and county of Philadelphia, State of Pennsylvania, have originated and designed a pattern for a Nubia, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying photographic illustration making part of this specification.

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying photographic illustration, to which reference is made.

B represents a portion of the body of the nubia, and A a portion of the border. The body may be figured as desired, but the border consists of three parallel stripes, *a b c*, wove in a zigzag order. The stripe *a*, which

is at the extreme edge, represents four threads grouped together, stripe *b* two, and stripe *c* two threads. The stripes are arranged a short distance apart, with a portion of the body shown between them.

What I claim as my invention is—

A design for a nubia, in which the border is composed of stripes, *a, b, and c*, wove in a zigzag order, and representing four threads grouped together in one stripe, and two threads in each of the other two stripes, substantially in the manner shown and described.
