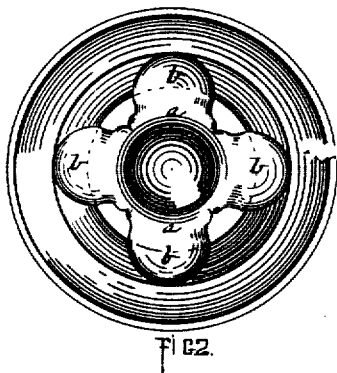
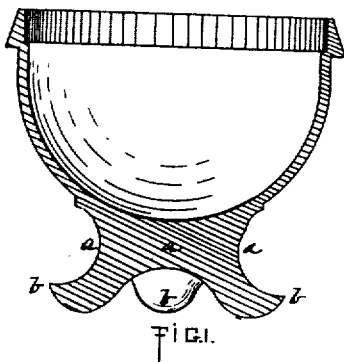

DESIGN FOR BASE OF GLASSWARE.

Specification forming part of Design No. 8,465, dated July 6, 1875; application filed June 17, 1875.
[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

CASE B.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JAMES B. LYON, of Pittsburg, in the county of Allegheny and State of Pennsylvania, have invented a new and useful Improvement in Design for Base for Glassware; and I do hereby declare the following to be a full, clear, and exact description thereof, reference being had to the accompanying drawing forming part of this specification, in which—

Figure 1 is a side elevation of a glass sugar-bowl provided with my improved base. Fig. 2 is a plan view of the under side of the article.

My improved design consists in a base of an article of glassware having a circular or continuous ring attached to the article, and

three or more feet projecting radially therefrom.

The continuous ring is shown at *a*, and the feet at *b*. The feet may extend out at angles to the ring *a*, or at the angle shown.

This design is applied in like manner to glass articles having bases.

I claim—

The design for base for glass articles shown and described, consisting of a continuous ring *a*, and three or more feet, *b*, projecting radially therefrom.
