DESIGN FOR LAMP-PEDESTALS.

Specification forming part of Design No. 8,481, dated July 13, 1875; application filed July 6, 1875. [Term of Patent 14 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, NATHANIEL L. BRAD-LEY, of West Meriden, in the county of New Haven and State of Connecticut, have invented a new Design for Lamp-Pedestal; and I do hereby declare the following, when taken in connection with the accompanying drawings and the letters of reference marked thereon, to be a full, clear, and exact description of the same, and which said drawings constitute part of this specification, and represent a front view.

This invention relates to a design for the pedestal of lamps, and similar burners, and consists in the figure of a dog in a sitting posture, as the principal feature in the pedestal, as shown in the accompanying illustration and hereinafter described.

On a base is placed the figure of a dog in a sitting posture, supporting, or as the essential feature in a support for, a lamp or other burner; the burner or fount, as the case may be, being above the head of the dog, as shown in the accompanying illustration, it only being essential that there be a burner or fount of some character combined with the dog in sitting posture, the chief element of the design.

I claim—

The design for lamp or burner pedestal, consisting of the figure of a dog in sitting posture, as shown in the accompanying illustration.
