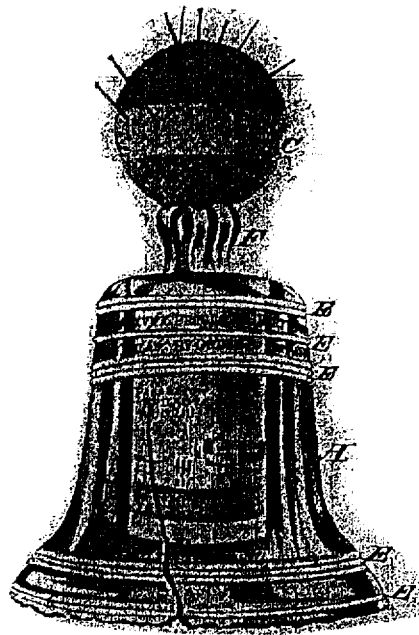

DESIGN FOR A PAPER-WEIGHT.

Specification forming part of Design No. 8,482, dated July 13, 1875; application filed June 26, 1875.

[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, HOMER LEE, of the city, county, and State of New York, have invented a new and original Design for a Combined Ink-Bottle and Paper-Weight, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying photographic illustration, to which reference is made.

A represents a piece of glass or other transparent substance, having the exterior form of a bell, and containing a picture, B, in the middle portion, the pictures being clearly visible through the transparency, and the top is surmounted with a pin-cushion of spherical form,

to be colored red, white, and blue. On one side of the bell is a line, D, representing the crack in the old "Liberty" bell, and the ribs or beads E, the top or cone by which it was hung, F, and other characteristics of that bell are represented on the exterior.

I claim as my invention—

A design for a paper-weight, consisting of a bell-shaped glass, having crack D, ribs E, and cone F, the whole surmounted by a pin-cushion, C, as shown and described.
