DESIGN FOR STOVE-COVER LIFTER.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,484**, dated July 13, 1875; application filed November 5, 1874.
[Term of Patent $3\frac{1}{2}$ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, HENRY C. BROWN, of New York, N. Y., have invented a Design for a Stove-Cover Lifter, of which the following is a specification:

My invention relates to a design for a handle for lifting the covers from stoves and ranges; and consists of lozenge-shaped reticulations in the handle, terminated at each end with collars or beads and joined to a smooth-curved shank.

To enable others skilled in the art to make and use my invention, I will proceed to describe its construction.

The figure is a photographic representation of my design, showing a plan view.

Letters of like name and kind indicate like parts in the figure.

A represents the end of the lifter which comes in contact with the cover, and B the shank, which extends to the handle C, all of which are made after my peculiar design. Its general shape is comely and graceful, the top being oval, or half round. At the junction of the shank with the handle is a rib or collar, *a*, made around the handle. The handle C is

perforated with diamond-shaped apertures, with the longer points running longitudinally with the handle.

There are superior advantages in this lifter, beside the beauty and advantages of its design, all of which harmonize in the utility of its purpose. It being made very light where the shank joins with the handle, the lower part may be quite hot. This thin part will radiate it with a rapidity almost incredible. The whole can be made so thin, and at the same time sufficiently strong after this design, that it immediately radiates all the heat that can be imparted to it from the top of a stove or range cover.

Having thus described my invention, what I claim as new, and desire to secure by Letters Patent of the United States, is—

The design consisting of the shank A B, collar *a*, and handle C, with lozenge reticulations, substantially as described.
