


DESIGN FOR A RUBBER ERASER.

Specification forming part of Design No. 8,486, dated July 13, 1875; application filed June 11, 1875. [Term of Patent 14 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, CHRISTOPHER ROB-ERTS, of Newark, in the county of Essex and State of New Jersey, have originated a Design for Rubber Eraser, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying drawing making part of this specification.

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying drawing, to which reference is made in said drawing.

Figure 1 represents a plan. Fig. 2 is a per-

spective view.

Similar letters indicate corresponding parts. My invention consists in the design of two elliptical segments meeting at angles, which form the ends of the eraser, whereby I obtain an article presenting a novel and distinguishing appearance.

In the drawing, the letter A designates the design of my eraser, which is composed of elliptical segments. These segments meet each other at the points B B, and the angles or corners thus formed constitute the ends of the eraser.

What I claim as my invention is—

The design for an eraser, of the elliptical segments A, meeting at the angles B B, substantially as shown and described.
