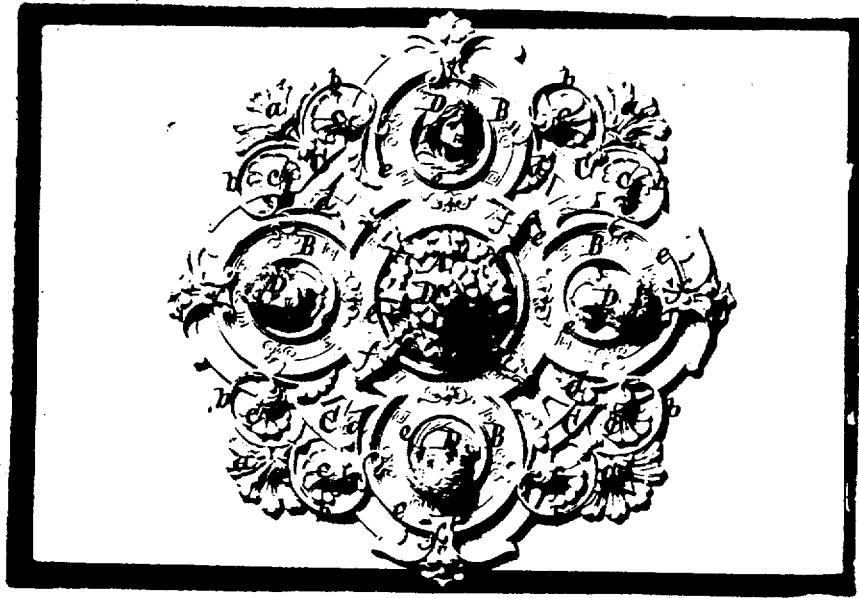

## DESIGN FOR A CENTER-PIECE.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,492**, dated July 20, 1875; application filed July 9, 1875.  
[Term of Patent 14 years.]

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, HENRY BERGER, of the city, county, and State of New York, have originated a Design for Center-Piece, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying photographic illustration, making part of this specification.

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying photographic illustration, to which reference is made.

The novel feature of my design consists in a central circular panel surrounded with exterior panels, and with arabesques, each of the panels containing an ornamental head, whereby I obtain a design presenting a very elegant and distinguishing appearance.

In the drawing, the letter A designates the central panel of my center-piece, which has a circular outline, and B are the exterior panels, which are similar to the panel A with respect to outline, and surround the same, being situated opposite to each other. The exterior panels B are divided from each other

by arabesques C, consisting mainly of a crest, *a*, and of stems *b*, bells *c*, and leaves *d*. The several panels contain each an ornamental head, D, whose effect is heightened by surrounding beads *e* and scrolls *f*, folded in symmetrical positions across the beads.

What I claim as new, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

1. The design for a center-piece of the central circular panel A, the exterior panels B, and arabesques C, substantially as shown and described.

2. The design for a center-piece, of the central circular panel A, the exterior panels B, arabesques C, and the ornamental heads D, substantially as shown and described.
