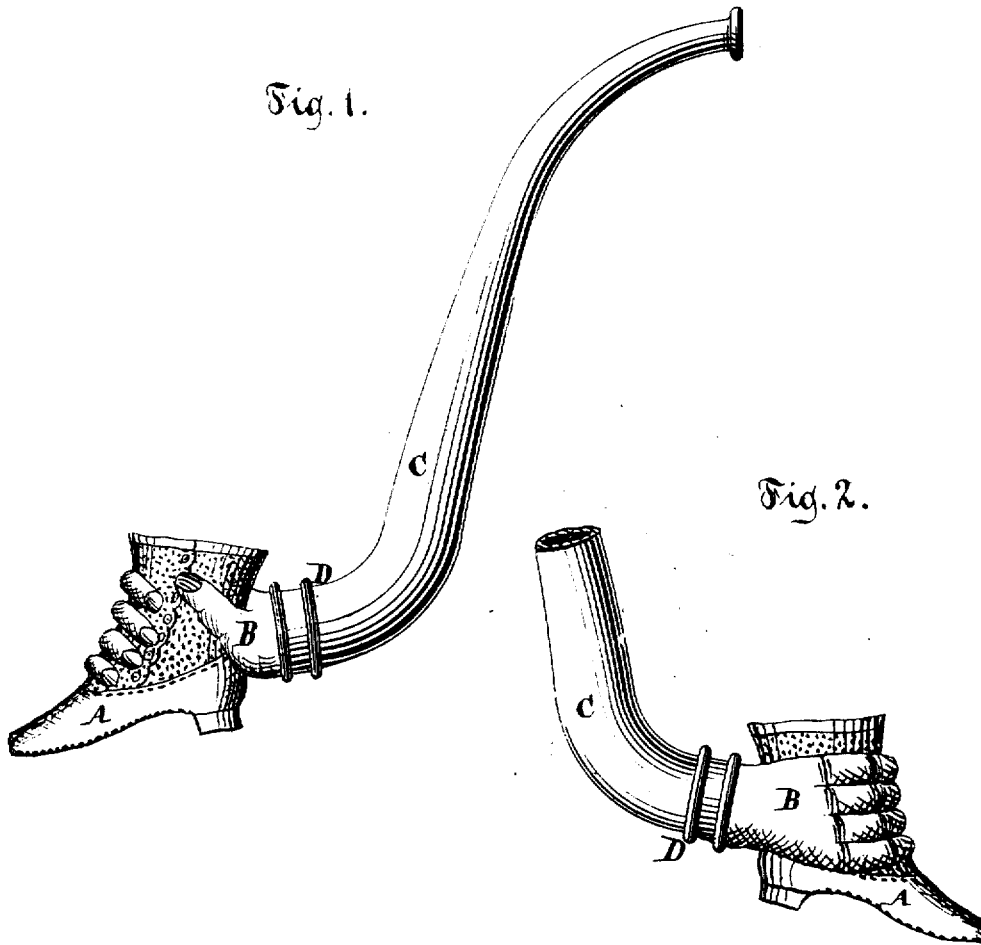

## DESIGN FOR TOBACCO-PIPE STEM.

Specification forming part of Design No. 8,493, dated July 20, 1875; application filed July 9, 1875.  
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, LÜDER G. HUSSMANN, of Guttenberg, in the county of Hudson and State of New Jersey, have originated and designed a new Pattern for Tobacco-Pipe Stem, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying drawing making part of this specification.

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying drawing, in which—

Figure 1 shows one side of my design. Fig. 2 shows the other side thereof.

Similar letters indicate corresponding parts.

My invention consists in the design for a pipe-stem of a boot or shoe which is grasped by the figure of a human hand forming the continuation of a bent stem, the wrist portion of the hand containing a bracelet, whereby I obtain a design presenting an elegant and distinguishing appearance.

In the drawing, the letter A designates a boot or shoe, and B is the figure of a human hand, the four fingers of which grasp the boot or shoe on one side, on the back, and on the

instep, while the thumb occupies the other side of the boot or shoe. C designates a bent stem, of which the hand B forms a continuation, the stem and the hand being divided from each other by a bracelet or band, D, encircling the wrist portion of the hand.

What I claim as new, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

1. The design for a pipe-stem of a boot or shoe, A, grasped by the figure of a human hand, B, forming the continuation of a bent stem, C, as shown and described.

2. The design for a pipe-stem of a boot or shoe, A, grasped by the figure of a human hand, B, containing a bracelet, D, and forming the continuation of a bent stem, C, as shown and described.
