DESIGN FOR GLASS VESSEL.

Specification forming part of Design No. 8,496, dated July 27, 1875; application filed May 7, 1875; [Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, EWARD FINNEY, of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, have invented a Design for a Vessel, of which the following is a specification:

My design for a vessel consists of a representation of the bell in Independence Hall, Philadelphia, the bell having a crack, a, in its edge, and the upper part b forming a hinged

edge, and the upper part b forming a hinged or removable cover for the vessel. The cover is formed by dividing the body near the top, which is provided with ears, and the latter may, if desired, be surmounted by a representation of an eagle, and the vessel may be inscribed with lettering similar to that upon the

Independence bell; but these features a essential, and form no part of my design

I claim—

The design for a vessel consisting of resentation of the Independence hell, near the top to form the cover, which mounted by ears, and hinged to the lower pointion, as shown.
