

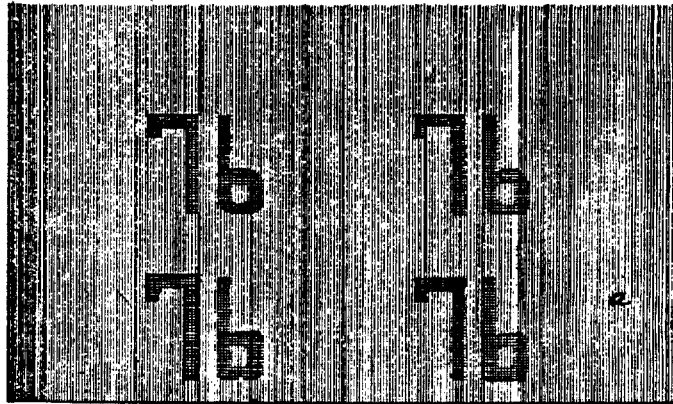

DESIGN FOR FABRICS FOR CLOTHING.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,550**, dated July 27, 1875; application filed July 19, 1875.
[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

CASE A.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, EDWARD C. CLARK, of Rockville, in the county of Tolland and State of Connecticut, have invented a Design for Fabrics for Clothing, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying illustration, to which reference is made.

The entire body or ground *a* of the fabric is substantially the same, and is a plain colored fabric, or it may be mottled or mixed, and of any desired class of weaving, and on such uniform ground is woven the figures "76," the same appearing in contrasting colors or weaves, and being arranged in columns either in the direction of the length or breadth of the fabric.

The figures may be varied in form and size from the figures shown, and may be placed in regular or irregular lines, and "17" may be placed, if desired, between the figures "76—76."

I claim—

The design for fabrics for clothing consisting of the figures "76," produced on a plain or uniform ground, as set forth.
